For each video answer the assigned questions. Be sure you read the questions carefully and provide a thorough answer to the questions. You are to answer on a blank sheet of loose-leaf notebook in pen (typed responses will not be accepted). Responses should be approximately 3-5 complete sentences each.

Unit 3: Human Migrations

1. Identify, explain, and provide examples of how and why early humans migrated out of Africa and across the varied landscapes.
2. Identify, explain, and provide examples of the kinds of evidence scholars use to trace the paths of early human migrations.

Unit 4: Agricultural and Urban Revolutions

1. Identify, explain, and provide examples of different patterns by which human societies around the world domesticated plants and animals.
2. Identify, explain, and provide examples when human societies began to settle down in urban societies and what early urban life was like.
3. Identify, explain, and provide examples of how human societies becoming more complex affected the ways people thought about social differences such as gender, status, and class.
4. Identify, explain, and provide examples for the impact urban technologies such as metallurgy and pottery-making had on the environment.
